



Cyber Security: Be prepared!

Cyber attacks are on the rise — and the tertiary sector is an attractive target. Each of these four steps makes a cyber attack against you less likely to succeed. They won't make you invulnerable, but they'll improve your cyber security right now.



Make passwords safe

- Make passwords long and strong, and change them regularly.
- Use different passwords for different applications.
- Encourage people to use password managers and give them guidance on how.



Use multi-factor authentication

- Make sure all users have at least two ways to identify themselves when they log in.
- One login password to access your systems is not enough to keep out cyber attacks.



Be aware and plan ahead

- Make sure everyone who uses your systems knows how important cyber security is.
- Have one person responsible for cyber security.
- Prepare a response to cyber attacks.



Update software and systems often

- Software and system updates contain important security fixes.
- Install software updates as soon as they're available.
- Update your systems at least monthly.
