



FOR PROVIDERS

Which fees are covered?

For learners undertaking an eligible programme and enrolled at Te Pūkenga
Wānanga, Private Training Establishment or University

When did the course* start?

Before January 2020

Fees will only be covered in exceptional circumstances and where a substantial proportion of their study occurs after 1 July 2020. A TEO can apply to the Tertiary Education Commission to consider payment of fees.

**Between January
and April 2020**

Full course fees will be covered if at least 75% of the course occurs after 1 July 2020.
Half of course fees will be covered if between 50% and 75% of the course occurs after 1 July 2020.
Fees will not be covered if less than 50% of the course occurs after 1 July 2020.

**Between May
and June 2020**

Full course fees will be covered if at least one third of the course occurs after 1 July 2020. Fees will not be covered if less than one third of the course occurs after 1 July 2020.

After 1 July 2020

Course fees up until 31 December 2022 will be covered.

*For funding purposes, programmes of study (e.g. qualifications) are made up of courses. The start and end date of your individual course (not the start date/end date of your qualification) determines whether fees are covered.

OR

For learners undertaking an eligible programme arranged by a Transitional Industry Training Organisation and receiving education providers**

Proportion of study and training that occurs from 1 July 2020 up until 31 December 2022 will be covered.
If fees for study and training that occurs after 1 July 2020 were paid prior to 1 July **2019**, these fees may not be refunded. Transitional Industry Training Organisations must notify the TEC where fees cannot be refunded.

**During 2021 and 2022 Industry Training Organisations are transitioning their arranging of training to Te Pūkenga or PTEs. These start and end date rules apply to eligible programmes currently and previously arranged by a TITO.
